

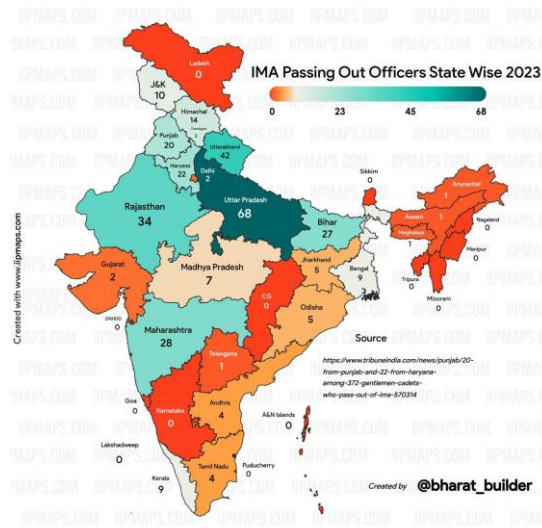


# **KRANTHIVEERA SANGOLLI RAYANNA SAINIK SCHOOL, SANGOLLI**

What is a Sainik school? What they are trying to achieve?

**Aim of Sainik Schools:** Sainik Schools in India stand as bastions of holistic preparation for entry into esteemed military academies. Their primary aim is to groom young minds academically, physically, and mentally for potential careers in the National Defence Academy (NDA) and other officer training institutions of the Indian Armed Forces. This new partnership mode of Sainik Schools promises a comprehensive educational experience in sync with national objectives and opens doors for collaboration in nation-building efforts.

Going for higher education is another good choice. They can study things like engineering or management. With a strong education, they can help in defense jobs or even do research. Joining the paramilitary forces is also an option. These forces, like CRPF or BSF, work on keeping our country safe inside its borders. Some might want to start their own businesses, using their leadership skills. Or they can try for civil services like IAS or IPS, ISRO working for the country in different ways. Sainik School Vijayapur, established in 1963, is co-ed, affiliated with CBSE, and fosters both boys and girls in various activities. Sangolli Rayanna Sainik School, set to be established in Belagavi, honors Sangolli Rayanna's legacy and aims to accommodate 1000 students from grades 6 to 12. Each school boasts extensive infrastructure, including sports complexes with indoor and outdoor facilities like swimming, squash, and football. Academic blocks with libraries, computer labs, and spacious classrooms foster holistic learning. Auditoriums support cultural and intellectual exchanges, while dormitories and mess areas ensure comfort, and disciplined nourishment.

#### **GRANTS AND SUPPORT RECEIVED BY SAINIK SCHOOL KODAGU & VIJAYPUR COMPARED TO NEW SAINIK SCHHOLS:**

The grants and support generally refer to financial assistances, resources or services provided by the government or other organisation to support a specific cause, in the context of the schools, grants and support can include funding for infrastructure development, scholarships or financial for students, training program for students/teachers, provision of educational materials and resources, and other forms of assistances aimed at improving the quality of the education or supporting overall functioning of the schools. It can also involve non-monetary support such as guidance, mentorship or networking opportunities provided by the government agencies and Educational institutions.

Basically the sainik schools are type of residential schools in India that are primarily run under the guidance of the Sainik school society. These schools aim to prepare students for career in armed forces. While they receive support from the central government, the state government also play an important role in the functioning of the sainik schools.

There are Five sainik schools in Karnataka, Sainik school Kodagu (established on 18th October 2007) and Sainik school Vijaypur(16 September 1963), and Third sainik school is Kittur Rani chennamma sainik school for Girls in kittur(under private management), fourth being VSOE- Mysore(2022), the fifth and most prestigious project of Karnataka government is Krantiveera Sangooli Rayanna Sainik School Sangolli (under Karnataka government). The state governments are responsible for providing Land and Infrastructure for setting up sainik schools within their respective states. Additionally the state governments contribute to the funding of sainik schools, either partially or fully, along with assistance provided by the central government. The funding allocation can change regularly and it depends on state government and its approval of the proposals submitted by the school.

We, Karnataka are having 2 old Sainik schools and 2 very new Sainik schools and the result we are giving and the representation of our state in the big picture is not seen and SS Bijapur & SS Kodagu being old schools and receiving financial assistance from the government had able to qualify just 17 and 14 Students for NDA exam. This might portray that we are clearly lacking some sense of belongingness and nationalism. Our school being a very new school promising to make sure that maximum representation is done by our pride state.

## What is Kranthiveera Sangolli Rayanna Sainik School?

The Government of Karnataka established Kranthiveera Sangolli Rayanna Kshetra Development Authority working under Backward Classes Welfare Department to execute the Sangolli Rayanna Sainik School at Sangolli village Bailhongal Taluk, Belagavi Dist, to commemorate Sangolli Rayanna, the army chief of Kittur ruled by Rani Chennamma who fought against British East India Company till his last breath.

### How it is different from other school?

Sainik Schools is established with the aim of preparing students academically, physically, and mentally for careers in the armed forces. Here are some key differences between Sainik Schools Sangolli and other sainik schools:

- Focus on Military Preparation:** We have a curriculum that emphasizes physical fitness, leadership training, and discipline alongside regular academic education. We prepare students for entry into the National Defence Academy (NDA) and other military academies from **grade 6<sup>th</sup> onwards**.
- Infrastructure:** Our school have infrastructure and facilities tailored to support students to develop themselves. These include drill grounds, sports complex which includes badminton court, table tennis court, large swimming pool, boxing, squash court etc.. And other facilities to foster physical fitness and leadership skills.
- Character Development:** We focus on developing qualities such as leadership, discipline, teamwork, and a sense of patriotism among students. The aim is to groom future officers for the armed forces. In order to inculcate this, we have 10 types of clubs where students are grouped and engaged in different activities.
- Uniform and Code of Conduct:** Similar to military institutions, Sainik Schools Sangolli have a strict code of conduct. Students wear Khaki uniforms from grade 6 and are expected to adhere to regulations regarding grooming, behavior, and academic performance.
- Extracurricular Activities:** While academics are important, we also place emphasis on extracurricular activities like sports, adventure activities, cultural, field trips, and social service where our school students visit the Sangolli village Government school to teach those young students which helps to develop well-rounded individuals.



#### ALL INDIA SAINIK SCHOOLS ENTRANCE EXAMINATION (AISSEE)-2024

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has been established by Ministry of Education, Government of India an independent/autonomous, self-funded and self-sustained premier testing organization.

NTA will be conducting the All-India Sainik Schools Entrance Examination (AISSEE)-2024 for admission to Class VI and Class IX in 33 Sainik Schools across the country for the academic year 2024-25. Sainik Schools are English medium residential schools affiliated to CBSE. They prepare students to join the National Defence Academy, Indian Naval Academy and other Training Academies, for Officers.

Ministry of Defence (MoD) has approved 19 New Sainik Schools, which operate in partnership with NGOs/private schools/State Governments. These approved New Sainik Schools function under the aegis of Sainik Schools Society. Admission to the Sainik Schools stream of Class VI of the New Sainik Schools, for the academic year 2024-25 is also through AISSEE-2024.

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has published the AISSEE eligibility criteria 2024 for admission to classes 6th and 9th. Sainik School Eligibility Criteria 2024 are the conditions that a child must meet to be qualified to sit for the Sainik School admission entrance examination. The primary components of the Sainik School entrance eligibility criterion 2024 are minimum age, state of residency, and educational qualification.

Both girls and boys are eligible to sit for the Class 6 AISSEE 2024 exam. As per the Sainik School Eligibility Criteria 2024, a student must be between the ages of 10 and 12 to be admitted to Class 6, and between the ages of 13 and 15 to be admitted to Class 9.

The students can apply for their Sainik school admission online application 2024-25 on the official website i.e., <https://exams.nta.ac.in/AISSEE/>. The application form for the Sainik School Admission can be submitted in a very easy way. The students can follow the steps mentioned below to fill out their Sainik School Admission form  
Step I: Visit the official website of the National Testing Agency i.e., <https://exams.nta.ac.in/AISSEE/>

- Step II: On the home page look for the link that says “Application form for AISSEE 2024”, and click on it.
- Step III: Now the Sainik school application form 2024 will appear on the screen, fill in all the details asked.
- Step IV: Pay the Sainik school application form 2024 fees.
- Step V: After filling in all the details and the fees for the application form click on the submit button.
- Step VI: At the end download the application form and do not forget to take a printout of it for further use.
